Carousel Syllabus Activity Lesson Plan

The instructor will briefly discuss with the class what information is available in the syllabus and provide the students with instructions on the activity. The instructor will split the class into 5-6 groups. The instructor will write the topics on the sheets which will be posted around the room.

Example topics include:

- 1. What is the purpose of this course?
- 2. How do I contact my instructor?
- 3. What is the grading policy?
- 4. What is the breakdown of assignments?
- 5. What days will we have speakers in class?
- 6. What is the purpose of this course?
- 7. What are the important policies I should be familiar with?
- 8. What's in it for me?

Instructions for students:

- ✓ Each group will stand in front of one of the flip chart sheets
- ✓ When I say go, write down as many ideas as possibly that fit the topic (You can use your syllabus).
- ✓ After one minute, when instructed, move to the next sheet and repeat the activity
- ✓ After they complete the activity, have one student from each group summarize the last sheet their group visited.
- ✓ Ask students to discuss what they learned from this activity and clarify the importance of the syllabus.
